Whether you are an academic researcher, a service provider, a practitioner, a policy analyst, or a community member, your in-depth knowledge of and expertise in the problems and challenges facing foreign-born communities are critical to the development of an applied and actionable research agenda that can advance the integration project.

We also invite you to collaborate with us and be part of our expanding networks of facilitators of immigrant integration. When you contribute to the research agenda, your name will be added to the Institute's networks, and you will receive invitations to future events, programs, and activities sponsored by the Institute.

All proposed ideas will be assessed against the existing body of research and practice literature. They will be rated and ranked by Institute staff and board of advisors based on potential impacts, feasibility, and timeliness. Ideas will be then prioritized by the board of advisors and a 2023-2024 Research Agenda will be developed.

The Research Agenda will be announced in July 2023 and a call will be issued soliciting proposals to address items on the research agenda. A selected number of proposals that address items on the agenda will be advanced through the 2023 Seed Funding Program. Contributing an idea does not guarantee that it will be funded.
