**AAPI New Yorkers**

Asian American, Native Hawaiian, and Pacific Islander New Yorkers are not a single homogeneous population, but a broad and diverse set of communities with distinct identities and experiences. The available data reflect that diversity by separately identifying groups such as Asian Indian, Chinese, Filipino, Japanese, Korean, Vietnamese, Native Hawaiian, Chamorro, Samoan, and Other Pacific Islander New Yorkers, as well as many residents who identify with more than one racial group. For that reason, this fact sheet presents an overall snapshot of AANHPI New Yorkers while also emphasizing subgroup differences that are often hidden when these communities are discussed under one umbrella label.
